Who is invited to contribute?

Refugee lawyers, law students and refugee advocates, plus occasional guest contributors from outside CARL as selected by the Editorial Board.

Types of contributions:

Short academic-style articles and papers, case comments, practice notes, book reviews, op-ed style opinion pieces, informal empirical studies or surveys, etc.

Some suggestions:

<u>Articles</u>: Could be based on submissions you have done on a particular legal issue, a previous conference presentation you want to explore in greater depth, a term paper, or simply ideas or concerns you wish to share on a particular topic.

<u>Case comments</u>: Have a favorite case or cases you use a lot? Share your insights! If you have a favorite FC judge you could also analyze their body of work;

Practice notes: Tips and advice on a particular procedure or process:

Book reviews: Review any book relating to refugees or refugee law;

<u>Empirical studies</u>: If you want to share ATIP results or any informal statistical research (for instance on RPD, RAD, FC, H&C or deferral decisions);

Op-eds: a short opinion piece or reflection on a refugee-related topic.

<u>Submission Guidelines:</u> Submissions should be 1000-2500 words in length excluding citations. All contributions should be original and in either French or English. Submissions must be submitted by email in Word, as an attachment. <u>Please use endnotes not footnotes</u>. Submissions will be reviewed for clarity and should generally adhere to UBC's <u>Legal Citation Guide</u>.
